We are certified by the Chimney Safety Institute of America-- or CSIA (see csia.org for more info)-- and as required for all contractors we are registered with Consumer Affairs (KVH# 13VH00984000).

Why is this important? Please continue reading:

As a property manager you are compelled to recommend an insured, well-trained, reputable contractor. How do you know if a contractor has any of these qualities? Looking for a certification such as one from the CSIA is a good place to start.

This means the certificate holder had to pass a test based on the NFPA 211 and NFPA 54 codebooks. In order to uphold their certified status they must also maintain their certification through continued education.

We know the responsibility of a property manager to recommend a solid service company cannot be taken lightly. A service company that does not perform a thorough chimney or dryer vent cleaning or inspection can make an already hazardous situation worse.

Leaving a connector hose, vent or chimney damaged or unclean can create a real fire hazard for the homeowner and other residents. Unfortunately, we have seen this situation occur time and time again.

Chimney Cleaning Process

Our cleaning process includes a basic Level One visual inspection. We start by laying down drop cloths to protect furnishings, carpets and flooring. Certified employs a high volume EPA chimney vacuum to control soot & dust.



We thoroughly clean the chimney flue, damper assembly and firebox with brushes and other pertinent devices.

We then visually inspect the inner hearth, refractory panels, fire brick and smoke chamber for any apparent damage. We look for evidence of moisture intrusion, warping, clearly evident liner damage, chase top damage, cap damage and other issues that may affect proper operation of the fireplace.

After clean-up and removal of the drop cloths, we report to the homeowner in writing any damages or potential issues that we've noted.
